#### **BOOKS**

Author (last name, first name). <u>Title</u>. City (where the book was published): Publisher, copyright date.

#### Examples:

Rowling, J. K. <u>Harry Potter and the Sorcerer's Stone</u>. New York: Arthur A. Levine Books, 1997.

Sachar, Louis. Holes. New York: Scholastic Inc., 1998.

## **INTERNET ARTICLES**

"Title of website." http://www.nameofwebsite.com, date.

## Examples:

"50states.com." http://www.50states.com, 2011.

"Infoplease." http://www.infoplease.com, 2011.

"Netstate." http://www.yahooligans.com, 2011.

#### **ENCYCLOPEDIAS / REFERENCE BOOKS**

"Article Title." <u>Title of the Reference Book</u>. Edition. Date published.

#### Example:

"Flying Fish." World Book Encyclopedia. 2<sup>nd</sup> ed. 1993.

## **MAGAZINES**

**Author** (last name, first name). "Title of Article." <u>Title of Magazine</u> Date (day month year): Page numbers of the article.

#### Examples:

Bay, Marianne. "Something Fishy Going Up." At Sea 7 June 1992: 34-35.

Redding, Marcia. "Two Stars Are Born." ZooNooz July 2000: 28-31.

## **PAMPHLETS**

**Author** (last name, first name). <u>Title</u>. City (where the pamphlet was published): **Publisher**, **copyright date**.

## Example:

Wang, C. Fish in Flight. San Diego: Marine Research Bureau, 1989.

## **VIDEOS / FILMS / SLIDES**

<u>Title</u>. Type of source (video, DVD, etc.). Production Company, Date. Time Length.

## Example:

<u>Flying Fish and Flightless Birds</u>. Videocassette. Classroom Science Productions, 1993. 30 mins.
